1 John 3:24 The one who keeps God's commands lives in Him, and He in them. And this is how we know that He lives in us: We know it by the Spirit He gave us. (NIV)

When the choir marched in that morning, I immediately got the 'eye' from my Mom. Needless to say, it didn't go well that day for me.

Obedience is not natural for anyone. We must choose to obey. It takes discipline and desire to honor and please the one that is in control. John states that the one who keeps God's commands lives in Him. The translation literally means that we abide in His word and by His directions. Knowing the word of God allows us to follow it and for Him to abide in us by His Spirit. It is in trusting the LORD that we find salvation and in obeying the LORD that we have sweet communion with Him. Let us abide in Him and He in us!

Dear LORD, forgive us in our disobedience and help us to desire to walk in You and You in us. We need Your guidance and direction in every step of our lives. In Jesus Name, Amen
