The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

Mt. 21:21-22 Jesus replied, "Truly I tell you, if you have faith and do not doubt, not only can you do what was done to the fig tree, but also you can say to this mountain, 'Go, throw yourself into the sea,' and it will be done. Faith is always the product of such a frame as this." Part of living an abundant life is realizing this very fact. As Paul stated in Gal. 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me. (NIV) It is not about what we desire, but what the LORD desires for us. You will find great comfort when you move away from the cares and strife of this world and instead, rest in the loving arms of the Savior. His thoughts become our thoughts and His mind and will become ours. Let us not come into the holy presence of the King with demands, but instead with humble hearts yearning for His will to be done in this day; in our hearts and our actions. It is only then that we will begin to see the will of the Father being manifested in our hearts and minds.
