The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

John 15:7 If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. (NIV)

But seen in its contextual position, Jesus is reminding us about our position in Him. This is not some profit-seeking promise. This is a statement of provision. Because of our selfish nature, we tend to only see things from our perspective instead of His. That why when we see this phrase, we think it is carte blanch and we can get whatever we want. Here is the problem. It is not what we want from a selfish point of view. It is what He wants. When we are living and breathing in Him, we will want the same things that He wants. His desires become our desires. His thoughts become our thoughts. His ways are our ways. It reminds me of the old song, 'Let Others See Jesus In You.' So let us seek Him first and His righteousness, and then all the other things will be added to us as well. We will be remaining in Him. Walking in Him. Living in Him. And loving like Him. That is where I want to be - in His presence.

Dear LORD, to abide in you is difficult and sometimes it hurts. It causes us to say no to the things of this world and yes to You, but the outcome is so much better. We can know that Your heart and Your mind is now leading us and guiding us. There is no better place that we can be. In Jesus Name, Amen
