The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

He is our fire-fighter when we face the flames of torment and strife. He is always ready to rescue us when we are hurting and needy.

Therefore; I love when I see this word in scripture. It reminds us of what He is there for. And here, it reminds us that since these former things are true, then there is no reason for us to fear; no matter how bad things seem to be. We need to be reminded of this every day. There will always be struggles, heartaches, wars, and temptations, but we do not have to face these things alone. He is our refuge and strength. He can and will be our refuge. Run to Him today. He will always be there for you, no matter what you are facing.
