## The Lord wants you to live in His liberty and freedom.

## 2 Cor. 5:21 God made Him Who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God. (NIV)

This is how God made reconciliation possible. Jesus, Who had never sinned, could be the only One to do this. He proclaimed this before the Jewish leaders in **John 8:46** *Can any of you prove Me guilty of sin? If I am telling the truth, why don't you believe Me?* (NIV)

The only One Who had never sinned could be the only One that could take on our sin. He did not become a sinner, but He instead became sin for us. This was a righteous act of love.
