The Lord wants you to live in His liberty and freedom.

Phil. 4:6-7 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (NIV)

Much has been written about prayer. It is certainly our connection by the Holy Spirit to the Father. It is in our prayer life that we enter into the Holy place with God. This peace is greater than we can even understand. It is the peace that transcends our comprehension. When we have that peace, we are blessed and centered in the will and way of our LORD, and He will be our guard over our hearts and minds. How awesome is that?
