The Lord wants you to live in His liberty and freedom.

1 Cor. 6:19-20 Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, Who is in you, Whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore, honor God with your bodies. (NIV)

The LORD no longer dwells in a temple made by the hands of men, but instead He now lives in the temple (the hearts) of those who have received Him. The temple is a sacred place.
