The Lord wants you to live in His light.

1 Chron. 29:11 Yours, LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is Yours. Yours, LORD, is the kingdom; You are exalted as head over all.

I believe that because David was a man after God's own heart, he was living the truth of 1 Pt. 5:6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time.

Beloved, let's make sure to continue to give God all the glory and praise that He deserves. To Him be the glory and honor both now and forever more!
