The Lord wants you to live in His light.

Heb. 10:23 *Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for He Who promised is faithful.*
(NIV)

Part of experiencing walking in His light is found in a steadfast resolve to stand by our convictions. In this passage, the writer of Hebrews exhorts us to do this very thing. The picture here is grasping onto something, not letting it go for any reason, at the risk of great peril. And what is it that we are to hold on to like that? The very hope of salvation; the profession of our faith. Far too many times have people confessed their hope and then wavered when the attacks of the evil one comes.

This is the essence of real faith. We must continue to trust in the midst of trials, heartaches, and struggle. Our hope is built on nothing less, than Jesus's blood and His righteousness. When we face this world's huge waves that want to sweep us away, we must hold on unswervingly to the hope that we profess. Why? Because He Who promised is faithful. He will always be our lifeline; our rock; our fortress in the storm. Let us hold on to the hope that He has given us and then use that hope to show the ones around us that He is faithful.
