Because God loves you, He Provides- Part 205

Did you know that God loves you more than anyone else could ever love you? God proves His love to you by **His future planning love**. **Jer. 29:11**, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

The Hebrew word for *plans* is **hamma cha shavot** which means *to devise, invent, think through and bring to pass*. If you have not already realized it, God has a purpose and plan for your life.
